In July 2022, the Ecumencial Senior Center (ESC) launched a capital building campaign to increase its program space by up to 12,000 sq. ft. to better serve the needs of seniors in Kalamazoo County.

We are happy to announce a significant grant of \$4 million from the Stryker Johnston Foundation that will bring ESC closer to achieving this goal. The generous contribution from the Stryker Johnston Foundation will create a significantly larger state-of-the-art facility serving the aging population in the City of Kalamazoo and surrounding areas for generations to come.
